School District No. 8 (Kootenay Lake) (SD8) covers a large geographical area that includes six families of schools: Nelson, Kaslo, Crawford Bay, Creston, Salmo and the Slocan Valley. We also offer online and alternative learning options for families, including ELEV8-our Provincial Online Learning School.

In each of our communities we offer Strongstart and Ready Set Learn programs for families of children aged 0 to 5. These free drop-in programs allow families to connect with their neighbourhood school, meet families with similar aged children, and access early learning resources.

Our schools enrol about 4,700 students from kindergarten to grade 12 and our district employs over 800 staff.

Our mission is to inspire and support each learner to thrive in a caring learning environment.

IS TRANSPORTATION AVAILABLE?

SD8 offers free busing for school aged children who live more than 2.5 km (primary students) or 3.0 km (intermediate and secondary students) from their school.

Children busing to and from their catchment area school have priority busing registration.

AS YOU PREPARE FOR SEPTEMBER...

In B.C. children are considered ready for kindergarten during the calendar year that they turn five.

Important routines to practice with your child include hygiene and self-care (washing hands, toileting) and development of independence in dressing (zippers, buttons, shoes, backpack).
